Abandoned by their parents as teenagers, brothers Lincoln and Booth learned to rely on each other. As adults, Lincoln and Booth are locked in a cycle of love and resentment, foretold by the names they were given by their father as jokes and compounded by the challenges of poverty and racism. In her “utterly mesmerizing” (*Variety*) Pulitzer Prize-winner—named the best American play written in the past 30 years by the *New York Times* and recipient of the 2023 Tony Award for Best Revival of a Play—celebrated writer Suzan-Lori Parks asks whether we can ever really change the cards we’re dealt as the brothers’ tug-of-war for dominance builds to devastating, life-changing consequences.

“We’re thrilled to close the 2023-2024 Season with *Topdog/Underdog*,” says **Artistic Director Ryan Rilette**. “With the masterful storytelling of Suzan-Lori Parks, the brilliant direction of Jamil Jude, two of DC’s best actors, and a truly amazing team of designers, this revival of one of the most celebrated plays of the 21st century is sure to be a theatrical highlight of 2024.”

The dynamic two-hander cast includes **Ro Boddie** (*The Mountaintop* and August Wilson’s *Radio Golf* at Round House Theatre; *Tempestuous Elements* at Arena Stage) and **Yao Dogbe** (*Nollywood Dreams* and *Ohio State Murders* at Round House Theatre; *Richard III* at Chicago Shakespeare Theater). The understudy for this production is **Monuaze Mason**.

The cast is joined by a talented creative team, which includes Scenic Designer **Meghan Raham**, Costume Designer **Danielle Preston**, Lighting Designer **Xavier Pierce**, Sound Designer **Nick Hernandez**, Fight Choreographer **Casey Kaleba**, Properties Coordinator **Chelsea Dean**, Casting Director **Sarah Cooney**, Dramaturg **Naysan Mojgani**, Card Manipulation Consultant **Ryan Phillips**, and Production Stage Manager **Che Wernsman**.

ARTIST INFORMATION

Suzan-Lori Parks (Playwright) is a multi-award-winning American writer and the first African-American woman to receive the Pulitzer Prize for Drama for *Topdog/Underdog*, which recently enjoyed its 20th anniversary Broadway revival. The production won both the 2023 Tony Award (Best Revival of a Play) and the Outer Critics Circle Award. Just last year, in 2023, Parks also had three new works which all received world premieres: at the Guthrie Theater in Minneapolis, *Sally & Tom* (Steinberg New Play Award finalist); at Joe's Pub in New York City, *Plays for the Plague Year* (winner of the Drama Desk Award for Best Music in a Play); and at the Public Theatre, Parks's world-premiered a musical adaptation of the 1972 film *The Harder They Come* (winner: Outer Critics Circle Award for Outstanding New Off-Broadway Musical).

Parks's other notable works for theatre include: *The Gershwins' Porgy and Bess* (Tony Award for Best Revival of a Musical), *Unchain My Heart: The Ray Charles Musical*, *White Noise*, *The Book of Grace*, *In the Blood*, *The Death of the Last Black Man in the Whole Entire World*, *The America Play*, *Father Comes Home From The Wars (Parts 1 ,2, &3)*, and *Fucking A*. Parks's marathon writing "diary play" *365 Days/365 Plays*— her first project in which she wrote a play a day for an entire year—was produced at more than 700 theatres worldwide, creating one of the largest grassroots collaborations in theatre history. A MacArthur "Genius" Fellow, Parks's novel *Getting Mother's Body* is published by Random House. She also writes extensively for the screen—most recently, as the scriptwriter for the film *The United States vs. Billie Holiday* and as the

showrunner/executive producer/head writer for the television show *Genius: Aretha*. In 2023, Parks was named among “TIME Magazine’s 100.” Other notable accolades and awards include the prestigious Gish Prize for Excellence in the Arts and grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, the Rockefeller Foundation, the Ford Foundation, the New York State Council on the Arts, and the New York Foundation for the Arts. She is also a recipient of a Lila-Wallace—Reader’s Digest Award, a CalArts/Herb Alpert Award in the Arts, and a Guggenheim Foundation Fellowship. In November 2022, Parks was inducted into the Theater Hall of Fame. She is Writer in Residence of the Public Theater, a professor at New York University, and an alumna of New Dramatists and of Mount Holyoke College, where she studied creative writing with James Baldwin, who encouraged Parks to begin writing for the theatre. In her spare time, Parks also writes songs and fronts her band Sula and The Joyful Noise.

Jamil Jude (Director) is a highly accomplished director, producer, playwright, and dramaturg focusing on bringing socially relevant art to the community. Jamil is the Artistic Director at Kenny Leon’s True Colors Theatre Company in Atlanta, Georgia, where he previously served as Associate Artistic Director. Additionally, he is the Co-Founder of The New Griots Festival, which is dedicated to celebrating, advocating, and advancing the careers of emerging Black artists in the greater Minneapolis-St. Paul metro area in Minnesota. Prior to joining the staff at True Colors, Jamil served as the Artistic Programming Associate at Park Square Theatre in St. Paul, a Producer in Residence at Minneapolis’ Mixed Blood Theatre, and a New Play Producing Fellow at Arena Stage in Washington, DC, and co-founded the Colored People’s Theatre. Among his many awards, Jamil has been named the recipient of the Turn The Spotlight Fellowship (2018/19), Andrew W. Mellon/TCG Leadership U Fellowship (2015/17), Nautilus Music Theater Management Fellowship (2014/15), NNPN Producer Residency (2011/12; 2012/13), Jerome Foundation/The Playwrights’ Center Many Voices Mentorship (2013/14) and the Allen Lee Hughes Fellowship at Arena Stage (2009/10; 2010/11). Jamil received his Bachelor of Arts from Colgate University.

ROUND HOUSE THEATRE HEALTH & SAFETY POLICIES

Round House Theatre no longer requires that audience members wear masks for most performances in our theatre. However, masks are required for certain performances and for events in other Round House spaces, including our Event Room. We continue to strongly recommend masks as the best way for individuals to protect themselves from COVID-19 and other seasonal viruses, and we ask our audience members to respect the choices of others.

Round House will offer a limited number of mask-required performances for audience members who may prefer a fully masked environment. **Masks are required for performances on June 18 (7:30 pm) and 22 (2:00 pm).**

ABOUT ROUND HOUSE THEATRE

Round House Theatre is one of the leading professional theatres in the Washington, DC area, producing a season of new plays, modern classics, and musicals for more than 50,000 patrons each year at our theatre in Bethesda. Round House has been nominated for 213 Helen Hayes Awards and has won 42, including four Outstanding Resident Play Awards and the Charles MacArthur Award for Original New Play in 2016. Round House's lifelong learning and education programs serve more than 5,000 students each year at its Education Center in Silver Spring, in schools throughout Montgomery County, and at our Bethesda theatre. Cornerstone programs include Free Play, which provides free tickets for students ages 13-college, the Teen Performance Company, which culminates in the student-produced Sarah Metzger Memorial Play, Summer Camp for students in grades K-12, and a full slate of classes for adults and youth.
